SEVENTH ANNUAL UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH SYMPOSIUM

The Western New York section of the American Chemical Society held its 7th Annual Undergraduate Research Symposium on Saturday, April 19, 2014 at the University at Buffalo.

This year's symposium attracted students and research mentors from 16 different colleges and universities, and featured 37 presentations on widely ranging research topics. The event attracted corporate sponsorship from Pearson Higher Education, McGraw-Hill, NanoMagnetics Instruments, Shimadzu Scientific Instruments and Krackeler Scientific, Inc.

The Symposium opened with a keynote address by Dr. Krista S. Walton of the School of Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering at the Georgia Institute of Technology entitled:

Synthesis and Application of Porous Inorganic-Organic Hybrids

Greg Sauer, SUNY Binghamton, was recognized with the Outstanding Poster Presentation award for "Transition State Analysis of Enantioselective Brønsted Base Catalysis by Chiral Cyclopropenimines". Other outstanding posters were presented by Dominic Sirianni of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, Bryna Torre and Matthew Crawley of University at Buffalo and Angelina Sparano of SUNY ESF.

Eoghan Connors of SUNY ESF won the prize for the best Oral Presentation for "Green Synthesis of Compounds with Biomedical Significance Facilitated by Water-Soluble Dendritic-Palladium Complexes". Also recognized were Daniel Stuart from McMaster University and Carly Rolph from Hobart and William Smith Colleges.
