The Education Committee of the Western New York section of the American Chemical Society (WNYACS) is accepting nominations for the **Outstanding High School Science Teacher of the Year Award**. On behalf of the WNYACS Education Committee, we request you to nominate a high school science teacher(s) for this year's award, or to refer our letter to your recognition committee or nominating personnel.

Our selection of the award winner will be based upon the following four points:

- -strength and innovation in teaching
- -exceptional service to students
- -efforts to stay well-informed regarding science progress
- -extracurricular activities in science and education

A completed nomination includes the following:

- 1) Your nominating statement regarding the nominee's achievements as a high school science teacher. Please limit this statement to 1000 words.
- 2) A supporting statement from the nominated teacher's supervising school principal. (In cases where the principal is not the nominator.)
- 3) Two to four additional supporting letters of recommendation. These can be written by supervisors, colleagues, or scientists who know the nominee's teaching accomplishments and technical abilities. <u>Please note, supporting letters from former students are greatly encouraged</u>. However, supporting letters from currently enrolled students are not to be included.
- 4) A curriculum vitae of the nominee containing pertinent details related to the criteria described, including a brief description of the nominee's educational background, special training, achievements and any publications or formal presentations.

Nominations are due by March 4th, 2022 by e-mail to the address shown at the bottom of this letter.

The awardee will receive an engraved plaque for the awardee's institution, an engraved glass for the awardee, a certificate and an honorarium. These will be presented at our annual Education Night Awards Dinner held in late April. We hope very much to be able to host this event in-person this year!
